Captured by Japanese forces in the Philippines, Bradley's resilience and selflessness earned her the moniker "angel in fatigues" as she continued to care for fellow prisoners amidst adversity. Liberated after three years of captivity, Bradley's steadfast commitment to service propelled her to become only the third woman in U.S. history to attain the rank of colonel.

The Persian Gulf War witnessed the remarkable courage of Brig. Gen. Rhonda Cornum, whose harrowing ordeal exemplifies the resilience of the human spirit. Surviving a helicopter crash and subsequent captivity, Cornum's tenacity and determination enabled her to overcome adversity and continue her military career, retiring as a brigadier general after dedicating decades to service.

Tragically, 1st Lt. Ashley White Stumpf's ultimate sacrifice in the Afghanistan War serves as a poignant reminder of the perils faced by female veterans. Tasked with building relationships with Afghan citizens, Stumpf's bravery and dedication were tragically cut short when she fell victim to an improvised explosive device during combat operations. Her legacy endures as a testament to the unwavering commitment of female veterans to their mission and comrades.
